Positive Behavioral Support and Interventions (PBIS) was initially created to protect and support students with disabilities. However, PBIS is beneficial for all students and provides effective Tier I interventions as well.

9 Examples of Positive Behavior Support & Interventions ...

School-Wide Positive Behavioral Interventions & Supports (PBIS) provides an operational framework for achieving these outcomes. More importantly, PBIS is NOT a curriculum, intervention, or practice, but IS a decision making framework that guides selection, integration, and implementation of the best evidence-based academic and behavioral practices for improving important academic and behavior outcomes for all students.

Interventions / Behavioral Interventions

Brief interventions integrated into routine primary care can effectively address the most common and important risk behaviors. 11-22 The strongest evidence for the efficacy of primary care behavior-change interventions comes from tobacco cessation research 11,12,14,15,19 and, to a lesser extent, problem drinking. 11,16-19,21,22 Accumulating evidence also shows the effectiveness of similar interventions for other behaviors. 11,19,20

Behavioral Counseling Interventions: An Evidence-based ...

Behavioral interventions employ the use of rewards and punishment and are at the most basic level of behavioral interventions. While these techniques should not be overused, they are the most simple to integrate with any classroom, provided the teacher believes in its power and knows how to implement it.

Tracking a student's behavioral progress is important. Schools gather and use data to make decisions about behavior interventions. School staff members are consistent in how they encourage expected behavior and discourage infractions. According to several studies, PBIS leads to better student behavior.

Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports | What Is PBIS?

To select the appropriate intervention consider what you think the most likely reason is for the student's behavior problem. This question will help with the selection of a class of behavior intervention (aquisition, attention seeking/proficiency, escape/proficiency, generalization or classwide).

Behavior Interventions - Evidence-Based Intervention Network

Early intervention with targeted, evidence-based or best practice behavioral strategies is key to reducing behavior concerns, minimizing suspensions and increasing learning and achievement. It is a vital component to reduce over-identification of students for special education or mental health diagnoses and referrals.

Interventions - Prevention & Intervention

School-wide /Tier 1 services are preventive and proactive practices and supports designed for all students in the general curriculum. Targeted Interventions/Tier 2 & 3 are supplemental services and interventions that are provided in addition to school-wide prevention services to those students for whom data suggests additional support is warranted.

Best Practice/Research-Based Prevention and Intervention ...

Answer: Delivering an evidence-based behavioral intervention with fidelity typically means that the teacher follows the structure of the program accurately and delivers the intervention in the way the developer intends. Standardized interventions are not sufficient for students with the most intensive needs.

What Is an Evidence-Based Behavior Intervention? Choosing ...

This gives them input on decisions about interventions they provide to students they serve. Including school personnel from different departments ensures an array of perspectives.
