### Salivary Gland Disorders - Cause, Symptoms & Treatment ...

Diagnosis of salivary disorders begins with a careful medical history, head, and neck examination. While complaints of xerostomia may be indicative of a salivary gland disorder, salivary diseases can present without symptoms. Therefore, routine examination of salivary function must be part of any head, neck, and oral examination.

### Diagnosing, managing, and preventing salivary gland disorders

Painless salivary gland swelling has a variety of causes, including neoplasm, sialadenosis, and the eating disorders bulimia and anorexia nervosa. There is significant overlap of presentations among those causes (FIGURE). Pain accompanying swelling is uncommon but not unheard of.

### Presentation is key to diagnosing salivary gland disorders ...

If your doctor or dentist suspects you may have a salivary gland tumor, you may be referred to a doctor who specializes in diseases of the face, mouth, teeth, jaws, salivary glands and neck (oral and maxillofacial surgeon) or to a doctor who specializes in diseases that affect the ears, nose and throat (ENT specialist).

### Salivary Gland Infections: Causes, Risk Factors, and Symptoms

The condition often accompanies other immune system disorders, such as rheumatoid arthritis and lupus. In Sjogren's syndrome, the mucous membranes and moisture-secreting glands of your eyes and mouth are usually affected first — resulting in decreased tears and saliva.

Dehydration is a risk factor for certain salivary gland disorders. To help maintain good oral health, it's important to drink lots of liquid every day to promote good saliva production. The major salivary glands include the parotid (on the cheek and under the ear), submandibular (under the jaw), and sublingual (under the tongue) glands.

### Salivary Gland Disorders - ENT Health

To diagnose other causes of swelling, a dentist or doctor may do a biopsy to obtain a sample of salivary gland tissue and examine it under a microscope. Other causes of blockage may be identified by newer techniques that use very small viewing tubes (endoscopes) that can be inserted into the salivary gland ducts.

### Salivary Gland Disorders - Ear, Nose, and Throat Disorders ...

A total of 146 patients with salivary gland disorders were enrolled and had their charts reviewed. The most frequent diagnosis among our sample was JRP (n = 44), followed by sialolithiasis (n = 36), acute unilateral sialadenitis of unknown origin (n = 32), and other salivary gland disorders (n = 34).

### Salivary Gland Disorders in Children and Adolescents: A 15 ...

Salivary gland stones. The chemicals in spit (saliva) can sometimes crystallise into a stone that can then block the salivary ducts. Some people form one or more small stones in a salivary gland. This occurs most commonly in people between the ages of 30 and 60 years, although it can occur at any age.

Sialadenitis: Sialadenitis is the medical term for an infection of a salivary gland. This infection is painful and usually caused by bacteria. It is more common among elderly adults with salivary gland stones, but can also occur in infants during the first few weeks of life.

Patients with salivary gland disease present with certain objective and/or subjective signs. An accurate diagnosis for these patients requires a range of techniques that includes the organized integration of information derived from their history, clinical examination, imaging, serology, and histopathology.
