Dysphagia also may be due to diseases of the muscles or the nerves that control the muscles of the pharynx and esophagus or damage to the swallowing center in the brain. Finally, the pharynx and the upper third of the esophagus contain muscle that is the same as the muscles that we use voluntarily (such as our arm muscles) called skeletal muscle.

Dysphagia (Swallowing Disorder) Definition, Causes & Diet

Swallowing disorders Swallowing disorders come in a variety of forms. Some are the result of disturbances of the brain such as Parkinson's disease, multiple sclerosis or amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS or Lou Gehrig's disease). Others are the result of malfunctioning of parts of the throat involved in swallowing.

Dysphagia means trouble swallowing. This condition can be long-term or it can come on suddenly. If your child suddenly has trouble swallowing, get medical help right away. Chronic dysphagia may be caused by an underlying health problem. Treatment for dysphagia depends on the cause of the condition.

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Dysphagia in Children

A variety of medical conditions cause swallowing disorders in pediatric patients . Aberrant right subclavian artery (ARSA) is a rare cause of dysphagia, but it must be taken into account in the differential diagnosis . The majority of patients with this abnormality remain asymptomatic.
