Although the Court said not all speech enjoys the same protection under the First Amendment (for instance, "fighting words" aren't protected), it affirmed that "the sort of expression in [the Hustler] case does not seem to us to be governed by any exception" to general First Amendment protection. Under Supreme Court First Amendment precedent, government speech is a relatively simple doctrine. In short, government can say whatever it wants. PREAMBLE : We the People of the United States, in Order to form a more perfect Union, establish Justice, insure domestic Tranquility, provide for the common defence, promote the general Welfare, and secure the Blessings of Liberty to ourselves and our Posterity, do ordain and establish this Constitution

First Amendment - Political Speech

First Amendment. The First Amendment to the U.S. Constitution reads: Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging the freedom of speech, or of the press; or the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the Government for a redress of grievances.

First Amendment legal definition of First Amendment

This amendment would give Congress and the states the power to regulate, restrict, and even ban political speech. The First Amendment would be effectively repealed, limited to protecting political speech only for the media. I don't think supporters of this amendment deserve to be reelected.
