Primary Care

The person who performs the lion's share of these duties has historically been considered the child's primary caretaker. When parents can't agree on shared parenting, a judge will usually grant primary physical custody to the parent who has spent the most time caring for the child on a day-to-day basis, i.e., the child's primary caretaker. The other parent will be awarded secondary physical custody.
