Drivers of Health Care Spending in the U.S. Prohibitively high cost is the primary reason Americans give for problems accessing health care. Americans with below-average incomes are much more likely than their counterparts in other countries to report not: visiting a physician when sick; getting a recommended test, treatment, or follow-up care; filling a prescription; and seeing a dentist.

At over 27 million, the number of people without health insurance coverage in the United States is one of the primary concerns raised by advocates of health care reform.
